No: UDD 225 MNY 2013, Bengaluru, dated: 28.02.2018.

In the exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (21) and (22) of section 423 of the Karnataka Municipal Corporations Act, 1976 (Karnataka Act 14 of 1977) and in supersession of Notification No. A 1(22) of 1952-53, dated 27th January, 1954, bye-law No. 25 and with prior approval of the State Government, the Bruhat Bengaluru, Mahanagara Palike hereby makes the following bye-laws, namely:-

Bye-Laws

1. Title and commencement.- (1) These Bye-laws may be called the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (pet dog licensing) bye-laws, 2018.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their Publication in the Official Gazette.

2. The owner of every dog kept within Bruhat Bengaluru Maha nagara Palike Limits shall obtain a License and get the same renewed every year on payment of such fee as may be notified by the Commissioner Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike get the Micro Chip implanted at his own cost as and when approved by the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike. The Veterinary Officer of the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike is authorized to issue the License.

3. The Veterinary Officer attached to the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike or Government of Karnataka has the right to inspect the dog anywhere or at owner's premises for a valid License.

4. One dog can be reared in flats and it shall be an approved breed as specified in Part-III of the schedule. In an independent dwelling house not more than three dogs are permitted, to prevent disturbance, nuisance for neighbours and the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike recommends the breeds in first schedule to the owner for this purpose.

5. It is responsibility of the owner to scoop the poop of his pet if it has committed nuisance in public place, park, etc. and deposit it in a designated place. Owners failing to scoop the poop shall be penalized a sum of rupees one hundred for the first offence and double the amount for second and subsequent time.

6. Any Pet dog or any dog without an ear notch or any Identification Mark as required under the Animal Birth Control (ABC) Programme as practiced by the Animal Welfare Organisations (AWOs) found straying without its owner in any Public Premises or Public Place or Private Premises or Private Place including Park, Bus Stand, Railway Station, Airport and other places like any road, temple, market, slaughter house, Cart Stand, hotel, Cinema, Toddy or Wine shop, Café, eating house, Rest House, choultry, factory, Industrial Premises etc., except notified living areas of Defense (Army or Navy) shall be liable to be captured by any person authorised by the Commissioner, Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike and detained in a dog's home or any other place appointed by him for this purpose. Such detention shall ordinarily be for seventy two hours but may extend for such longer time as the Commissioner may consider necessary and every such person authorised by the Commissioner to capture dogs shall wear a Badge or Identification Card obtained from the Commissioner and shall be bound to show it to the owner of the dog if so required.

7. Any Pet dog or any dog without an ear notch or any identification mark as required under Animal Birth Control (ABC) Programme as practiced by the Animal Welfare Organisations (AWOs) found at large in any Public Premises or Public Place or Private Premises or Private Place without a Collar and Badge bearing the Municipal License number and any dog found at large in any Public Premises or Public place or Private Premises or Private Place shall, if possible be captured and detained as provided in Bye-law 6.

8. Any pet dog or any dog without an ear notch or any identification mark as required under the Animal Birth Control (ABC) programme as practiced by Animal Welfare Organisations (AWOs) for which a License has been obtained by the owner and detained under bye-law 6 or bye-law 7 may be redeemed by its owner on payment of a fee of rupees four hundred and fifty only within seventy two hours of capture or such longer period as the Commissioner may have appointed and in the case of any dog for which no License has been obtained before impounding, a sum of rupees five hundred and fifty only shall be charged the owner of the dog before releasing.

9. In the case of dogs so detained, the Officer in charge of the dog's home or other place shall at once send to the Owner of every dog wearing a numbered badge, a Notice stating that, if within the time stated in such notice the owner does not pay rupees four hundred and fifty only and take the dog away from the place of detention, it shall be sold in auction or sent to shelter home or detained in a dog pound.

10. Dogs detained under bye-law 7 or bye-law 8 and not claimed by their owners within seventy two hours or such longer period, if any, as may have been specified in the notice issued under bye-law 9 shall be disposed off as follows:-

- (1) If they are healthy and a Veterinary Officer has no reason to believe them to be suffering from rabies or any disease, the dogs shall be considered as stray dog and dealt as per Animal Birth Control (dogs) Rules, 2001. Such dogs shall be made available for adoption or the dog shall be sold in public auction by the Veterinary Officer and the sale consideration credited to the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahagara Palike funds.
- (2) A Veterinary Officer attached to the Department of Animal Husbandry, or to the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike and working within the limits of the City of Bengaluru may euthanise any dog which, in his opinion is suffering from rabies or detain any dog if he suspects it to be showing symptoms of rabies.
- (3) The Veterinary Officer or the Dean, Veterinary College, Hebbal or Director, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services or Institute of Animal Health and Veterinary Biologicals (IAH&VB), may direct that any dog which he knows or suspects to be suffering from rabies or which has been bitten or snapped at by any rabid or suspicious dog, Jackal or other animal shall either be euthanised immediately by himself or any person authorised in this behalf by the Corporation Commissioner of Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike or at the option of the owner confined under observation at the owners expense in the dog's home or other place appointed for the purpose for such period as the Commissioner, Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike or Veterinary Officer in his behalf may fix. Dogs impounded for observation shall be treated as stray dogs and euthanised, if they are not claimed by the owners concerned within three days after the expiry of the period of observation, viz., ten days.
- (4) Any person who has in his possession any dog which he knows or has reason to believe to be suffering from rabies or to have been bitten or snapped at by any rabid or suspicious dog, Jackal, or other animal shall immediately intimate the fact to the area Veterinary Officer or Health Officer of the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike.

11. Prevention of diseases of animals.- (1) The keeper of every animal like Horse, Dog, Cattle, Sheep or Goat, etc shall give immediate notice in writing to the Commissioner of Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike or Veterinary Officer or any other authorised Officer of the occurrence of any infectious or dangerous disease among the animals and shall segregate or remove all such animals to such place as the Commissioner or Veterinary Officer or other authorised officer may direct and shall not sell or cause to be sold or use or cause to be used the Milk or other produce of any such animal for any purpose without the written permission of the Commissioner or Veterinary Officer or other authorised Officer.

(2) He shall, whenever required by the Commissioner or Veterinary Officer or other authorised Officer permit the inspection of the animals kept in such premises and render all assistance to facilitate examination.

12. Whoever commits a breach of bye-laws 1, 8 or 9 shall be punishable,-

- (a) with a fine which may extend to rupees one thousand and in case of a continuing breach, with fine which may extend to rupees three hundred for every day during which period the breach continues after conviction for the first breach; or
- (b) with fine which may extend to rupees two hundred for every day during which the breach continues after receipt of notice from the Commissioner of the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike to discontinue such breach.
